HOW TO GET THERE

By car

Fifteen minutes from Mechelen.

The Winter Garden is part of the Ursuline Institute. The entrance is 200 meters from the church, opposite house number 22. (Use this house number for your GPS). You can park free of charge close by (P1 or P2).

By public transport

Take the train to Mechelen railway station, and then the number 510 bus from stand11. Get off at the OLV-Waver Kerk stop, 200 meters from the entrance to the Winter Garden. For more information about buses, go to: delijn.be.

By bicycle

The Winter Garden is located between intersections 35 and 36 on the national cycle network.








Entering the Winter Garden feels like a never-ending spring. Just look around at the enchanting interaction between light and colour!
