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HOW DO I USE THE STEP-BY-STEP PLAN?

Great that you decided to do the listening walk 'If walls could talk'. In collaboration with Visit Mechelen,

Tourism for Autism has designed a step-by-step plan to prepare you for this activity.

Below you can read how to use this step-by-step plan.



This step-by-step plan contains lots of information.

Not all of this information is important to everyone.

For example, you have several options for going to Mechelen.

You can go by car, by train, by bike, on foot...



You can choose the pages that apply to you.

Choose which pages to print out in the next phase.



You can write this on a sheet of paper so you don't forget anything while printing.



Then print the pages you selected in the previous step.

And print out the practical arrangements if you want to use them.



Once you have printed out the step-by-step plan, keep it in a folder.

This way, the pages won't get mixed up.

You can choose for yourself whether to do this.



You also have to fill in some sentences yourself in the step-by-step plan.

For example, write on the dotted line at the beginning when you are going to the start of the listening walk and who will accompany you.

So, you can read the entire step-by-step plan and fill in all the info on the dotted lines.

HOW DO I USE THE STEP-BY-STEP PLAN?



You will also see two clocks at the start of the step-by-step plan. Read what it says underneath and draw that time on the clock.



Now you can really start preparing for this trip.

Choose a quiet moment so that you are not in a hurry to read the step-by-step plan.

Read the step-by-step plan at the latest the evening before you leave.

Do this at least once. If you want, you can read the step-by-step plan earlier.

You can also read the step-by-step plan more than once.

Everything depends on your needs.



If this step-by-step plan is for young children, read it together with them the first time. That way you can ensure the child understands everything and can ask questions.



If you want, you can take this step-by-step plan with you for the listening walk. This is not necessary for the visit to be a success.



So now you're all set to go on a journey.





I can ask about this at the Visit Mechelen desk.






When I'm in Mechelen, I look for a parking space for the car. The nearest paying car park is Parking Indigo Mechelen Grote Markt.

I walk inside through the sliding glass door. I arrive in a small entrance hall.

I go up the stairs.




I go to the Visit Mechelen desk.



Sometimes there may be other people queuing at the desk. I do my best to wait patiently.

If no one is queuing, I can go straight to the desk.


ARRIVAL



It's my turn.

I tell the member of staff at Visit Mechelen that I would like to do the listening walk 'If walls could talk'.

I also mention how many people want to participate.



There is no fixed price for the listening walk.

I pay what I can afford.


A suggested price for the walk is between 5 and 20 euros per person.



Each person in my group is given a wooden listening horn.

On this listening horn there is a cord that I can hang around my neck.

Attached to the cord is a little electronic box. This allows me to press start/pause during the walk.



During the walk I can hear the listening story through the listening horn.

ARRIVAL



If I prefer, I can simply ask a member of staff for normal earphones to listen to the listening story.



I also get a brochure.



This brochure contains a map of the city of Mechelen indicating the route for the walk.

This also lets me see which places I will visit.



The member of staff will install the audio guide for me.

I can choose the language of the story I'm listening to.

The story is available in Dutch, French, English, German and Spanish.

When the member of staff has finished, he/she will explain the walk.

Then I'm ready to go.



THE LISTENING WALK 'IF WALLS COULD TALK'

IF WALLS COULD TALK



During the listening walk, I will visit many beautiful places in Mechelen.

Along the way I will also learn about the city's history during the Renaissance.



The walk consists of 11 stops and the last one is the same as the first.

So I walk a loop of 3.5 kilometres.

If I want, I can take a shorter route.

Then the walk is 2 kilometres.



The walk starts in the Visit Mechelen building.

IF WALLS COULD TALK



I don't have to type in a number on the audio guide.

The correct story is selected immediately.

When I hear the sound of a bell, it means I'm close to the next story.



Then I press the green play button.

I hold the listening horn to my ear and listen to the story. The listening story is narrated by different actors.

I also hear background noises.



In the meantime, I can continue walking if I want. I repeat this with every stop that I come to.

When I'm finished with the first story, I go back outside. I follow the path to the left along the route on the map.

In order to follow the story properly, it is important that I do the first 7 stops in the right order.

After that, I can skip stops if I want.



On the map, I can see the different stops.

Next to and under the map, I see photos of the various stops. The number on the photo is always at the place where there is a board showing the stop number.

This is how I know I'm in the right place.

At some stops, I can take a look inside the building.

If the building is closed during my visit, I can take a look on my smartphone via the website www.virtueelmechelen.be.



The first stop is in the Visit Mechelen building.



The second stop is St Rumbold's Tower and Cathedral.



The third stop is City Hall, the Cloth Hall and the former prison.

IF WALLS COULD TALK



The fourth stop is the Palace of Margaret of York and Hof van Kamerijk.



The fifth stop is the Palace of Margaret of Austria and Hof van Savoye (Court of Savoy).



The sixth stop is Hof van Busleyden.



The eighth stop is the Beguinage Church.

IF WALLS COULD TALK



The eighth stop is the Beguinage Church.



The ninth stop is Kraanbrug (turn rail bridge).



The tenth stop is Vismarkt (Fish Market).



The eleventh stop is the Schepenhuis (Aldermen's building), the location of Visit Mechelen.

This is the same location as the starting point.

The story I'm listening to here will be different from the first.

When I'm done with the walk, I head back to Visit Mechelen.



I hand the listening horn and the audio guide back to the member of staff.

If I borrowed earphones, I give these back as well.


There is a toilet in the Visit Mechelen building. I follow the arrows to floor -1.
